The Arabian Racing Cup (ARC) is once again rewarding breeders with a supplemental \$1,500 per race - \$500 each for the horses that finish first, second and third in specified races. To date, Delaware Park has had one such race with more to be held throughout the meet.

On July 3, a maiden race included the \$1,500 Arabian Racing Cup breeder's incentive bonus. Congratulations to the following breeders who were awarded \$500 for their horses finishing first, second and third:

1st Mystical MHF (Madjani x Morning Lyght, by Monarch AH) bred by Mandolynn Hill Farm (pictured left).

2nd Highh Shine (Burning Sand x DC Willful Spirit, by Virgule Al Maury) bred by Debra and Paul Lemmons.

3rd RB Sand Castle (Burning Sand x Royal Fanfare, by Monarch AH) bred by Dianne Waldron.

Arabian Connection's Statistics Strong Against All Competition

When considering all horses at Delaware Park, the Arabians, and Arabian connections, are doing quite well. Through July 21, based on number of wins, Ivory Shores (pictured top left), owned by Quarter Moon Ranch and trained by Scott Powell, leads all horses with 4 wins from 4 starts.



Jernesto Torrez (pictured bottom left), with 8 wins, is tied for second with Michael E. Gorham behind Michael L. Catalano, Jr. and Anthony Pecoraro who each have 10 wins. Lynn Ashby and Jamie Ness are right behind with 7 wins each.

Delaware Park's leading rider Carol Cedeno is also a regular Arabian rider. She leads all jockeys with 20 wins followed by Scott Spieth with 14. Ricardo Chiappe, who is a leading Arabian rider, is also among the top jockeys with 9 wins.

Extra H-2B Visas Made Available

U.S. businesses will be able to hire up to 15,000 additional temporary non-agricultural workers under the H-2B program following a final rule that the Departments of Homeland Security and Labor submitted to the Federal Register this week. To qualify for the additional visas, petitioners must attest, under penalty of perjury, that their business is likely to suffer irreparable harm if it cannot employ H-2B non-immigrant workers during fiscal year (FY) 2017. It was determined there are not enough qualified and willing U.S. workers available to perform temporary nonagricultural labor to satisfy the needs of some American businesses in FY 2017.

Congress gave Department of Homeland Security Secretary John Kelly the discretionary authority to address the lack of available temporary workers and provide this one-time increase to the congressionally set annual cap. H-2B visas are used for temporary, non-agriculture workers at a variety of businesses, including racetrack grooms and handlers. The government offers 66,000 such visas a year, with the 2017 cap having been met within the first 30 days of open enrollment. This left many organizations without access to the critical labor pool provided by the H-2B program.

Starting this week, eligible petitioners for H-2B visas can file Form I-129, Petition for a Nonimmigrant Worker and must submit a supplemental attestation on Form ETA 9142-B-CAA with their petition. A new tip line to report general H-2B abuse and employer violations has also been established.

Details on eligibility and filing requirements are available in the final rule and on the One-Time Increase in H-2B Nonimmigrant Visas for FY 2017. This page also includes information on how individuals can report abuse in the program.
