DELAWARE-BASED RUNNERS LEAD THEIR DIVISIONS

Many of the leading earners that raced all season at Delaware Park finished their 2015 schedule at Lone Star Park in Texas. Their strong showings there helped them clinch many of the top spots of divisional earning.

Uptown Dannys Boy (Burning Sand x Wibwilcca), the leading 3-year-old colt earner for 2015, won his first 4 starts at Delaware Park before shipping to Texas. He ended his year with a solid second in the DIAR Texas Lone Star Futurity. He is owned by Jon and Krista Henningsgard of Uptown Arabians.

Jewell AA (Burning Sand x Triumphs Pearl), led all 3-year-olds by earnings with \$39,500. Owned by

Joe and Betty Gillis, won or placed in her 5 starts this year, including 4 races at Delaware Park. She too finished her season at Lone Star with a win in the www.shadwellarabian.co.uk Texas Lone Star Futurity over Delaware-runner Lady Haha (Norphe x Hilaritie), owned by Paul and Kathy Smoke.

Fearsome (Thoroughbred x Dixies Valentine), full brother to Delaware Park Arabian Derby (G2) winner F Sixteen, finished a distant second to Paddys Day in the standings for 4-year-old colts and geldings with \$33,925. Owned by Guy Neivens, he won 3 and placed second 3 times in 9 starts, all at Delaware Park.

Rosebrook Farms LLC's RB Frynch Broad (Madjani x Frynch), was the leading 4-year-old Filly, bolstered by her win in the Cre Run Arabian Oaks (G2). Following her was All N All (Dahess x All Tu Sexy), who split her time between Delaware and Texas in 2015.

Cre Run Enterprises-bred Royal Richess (TH Richie x Royal Atheena) and Our Princess (Nivour De Cardonne x Monarchs Princess) competed against each other all year at Delaware Park. In the end, Royal Richess edged out her stablemate in earnings with \$38,235 vs. \$37,670. Leading earner in the Old Mare division was DC Willeys Song (Doran SBFAR x Wibwilcca), who shipped in to capture the grade 1 Buzz Brauninger Arabian Distaff H. (G1).

Finally in the Older Horse division, Thess Is Awesome (Dahess x In Awe), bred and owned by Cre Run Enterprises LLC, made 4 starts at Delaware Park before finishing his season on a high note by winning the Dubai International Arabian Races Texas Open S. at Lone Star Park.

Once again, it shows that the most successful horses race at Delaware Park.

COMMISSION?

The Delaware Thoroughbred Racing Commission regulates and oversees the sport of Thoroughbred and Arabian racing in the state.

The Commission's main objectives are to eliminate fraudulent activity that would undermine the public trust, bringing violators of commission rules, regulations and Delaware law to justice; to protect, preserve and promote agriculture and horse racing by preventing and eliminating corrupt practices; ensure fairness in licensing and patron decisions; and ensure that the state and betting public receive fair percentages of the wagering dollar by overseeing audits.

The Commission usually meets monthly during racing season, with public meetings scheduled and advertised at least seven days in advance.

THERE ARE TWO 11-YEAR-OLD GRADE 1 WINNERS!

When So Big Is Better won the Delaware Park Arabian Classic (G1) we thought, at age 11, he was the oldest racehorse of any breed to win a graded stakes...much less a grade 1. Well, that is true...to a point. Eleven is the oldest age for a grade 1 winner of any breed, but So Big Is Better wasn't the first horse to do it. It was, in fact, Mr Full Service. Remember him? Foaled in 1992, Mr Full Service (Sam Tiki x BW Ali Catt, by ZT Ali Baba) was owned by Bill and Cathy Waldron and trained by Bill as well.

Mr Full Service raced for 9 years to a record of 73(20-16-15)7-19, \$342,597. He was named Darley Champion Older Horse in 1998.

Over the next few years he continued to race sparingly and in 2003, at age 11, Mr Full Service won the Arabian Cup Championship Sprint (G1) at Delaware Park. Thus he was the oldest graded stakes winner of any breed. So Big Is Better tied with him in 2015. I guess we'll have to wait and see if So Big Is Better tries to set the record at age 12.

Our apologies to Bill and Cathy Waldron and to Mr Full Service himself, for overlooking this great accomplishment.
