To start with in 2015, there are two overnight races offered per week, along with substitute races. As you can see, purses range from \$10,000 to \$15,000 per race, which are the highest overnight purses offered in the country. Every white type race carries the purse equivalent of an overnight stakes race. It gives horsemen a chance to race for more money as well as to run a high quality meet.

As a reminder, the following stakes races will be run in 2015: the Delaware Park Arabian Oaks (G2), sponsored by Cre Run Enterprises LLC on July 11; the Delaware Park Arabian Derby (G2), sponsored by Mark Powell on July 18; the Delaware Park Arabian Juvenile Filly Championship (G3) sponsored by Markel Corp. on August 22; the Buzz Brauning Arabain Distaff H. (G1) sponsored by The Emirates Equestrian Federation on September 5; the Delaware Park Arabian Classic H. (G1), sponsored by the Emirates Equestrian Federation (G1) on September 12; and the Delaware Park Arabian Juvenile Championship (G3), sponsored by the Emirates Equestrian Federation also on September 12.

Stalls on the backside are free. Our responsibility is to have our Arabians ready to go when the meet begins and to fill the gate in every race. Make your plans now and be ready to run in May!

## NEWS FROM THE ARABIAN HORSE ASSOCIATION

### EXPORT FEE CHANGE AND PASSPORTS

The Arabian Horse Association (AHA) is excited to share its latest enhancement regarding Export Certificates. As you may know, the World Arabian Horse Organization (WAHO) requires a Passport be issued on each horse that is being exported from the United States. AHA has updated our registration system to accommodate this, and the Passports have turned out beautifully. The design represents the pride that they have in our horse, the United States and the Arabian Horse Association.

Effective January 1, 2015, the fee for the Export Certificate increased to \$150 (member rate) and it now includes a Passport. The passport will be sent with the export documents directly to the foreign registry. If you would like the Passport in advance so that it can travel with the horse, this should be indicated on the Export Checklist. There will be an additional \$25 fee for the overnight shipping in this instance.

They are now able to issue a Passport for any domestic AHA registered Arabian, Half-Arabian or Anglo-Arabian also. The fee for a domestic Passport is \$50 (member rate).

### NEW SWEEPSTAKES RULE OFFERS ADDED VALUE FOR RACE HORSES

A recent change to the AHA Breeders Sweepstakes program now offers added value for Arabian racehorses.

The new rule allows foals to be eligible for the sweepstakes program as long as their purebred dam is nominated. The purebred sire is no longer required to be nominated. This means that a race-bred foal that doesn't make it to the track (and whose dam is nominated) has added value in an alternative career as an endurance or show horse with sweepstakes benefits. Similarly, this offers sweepstakes benefits for racehorses that go on to a second career in endurance or the show ring after racing.

Broodmares may be nominated for a lifetime fee of \$1,000 with no deadline. Foals may be nominated for \$400 by December 31st prior to year of foaling.

According to Lara Sawaya, Director of the Festival, the Darley Awards will be given glamorous treatment over two evenings. The awards themselves will be presented on April 3 at the Dolby Theater (formerly the Kodak Theater) in Highland Center. The Celebration Banquet will be held the following evening, and the host hotel will be the Beverly Wilshire, a Four Seasons Hotel.

## *THE LATEST FROM TEXAS*

All N All (Dahess x All Tu Sexy) made her first start of the year in the Texas Yellow Rose (G2) at Sam Houston and held off a fast closing RB Frynch Broad with RB Rich Kin third. Time for the 7 furlongs was 1:35.96. Bred and owned by Cre Run Enterprises LLC, the 4-year-old filly is trained by Lynn Ashby and ridden by Kirsten Swan. All N All broke her maiden last fall at Delaware Park in her only other start. You will be seeing her when Delaware Park opens later this year.

Paddys Day (Burning Sand x AK Loretta) had to survive a stewards inquiry into the stretch run, but no action was taken, and he stayed on top of the Texas Six Shooter (G2), winning by 8 lengths over Lazur Hess and ES Mi Cielo. Paddys Day, bred by Jane Teutsch and owned and trained by Scott Powell/Quarter Moon Ranch LLC, completed the 7 furlongs in 1:33.67 under jockey Kalsi Purcell. Lazur Hess will be racing at Delaware Park, and we can only hope Paddys Day will come as well so they can continue this budding rivalry.
